## AMUR LEOPARD

The Amur leopard is a solitary animal. It is a nimble footed cat. They have been clocked at going 37 mph. This incredible animal has been reported to leap more than 19 feet horizontally and up to 10 feet vertically.



## BORNEAN ORANGUTAN

These orangutans can weigh up to 200 lbs! The Bornean orangutan differs in appearance from the Sumatran orangutan, with a broader face and shorter beard and also slightly darker in color.



## BLACK RHINO

The smaller of the two African rhino species. They are browsers rather than grazers and use their pointed lip to feed on leaves from bushes and trees. Typically they have two horns but can have a smaller horn on their posteriors.



## HAWSBILL TURTLE

They are named for their narrow pointed beaks. This turtle has a distinctive pattern on its back that forms a serrated look. Sea turtles are the living representatives of a group of reptiles that has existed on Earth and traveled our seas for the last 100 million years!
